

Institution regularly organizes and celebrates national festivals and birth / death anniversaries of the great Indian personalities. Few are mentioned below

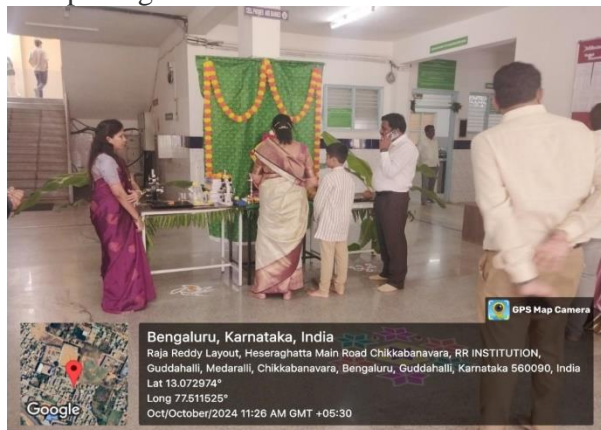
Onam Celebration
